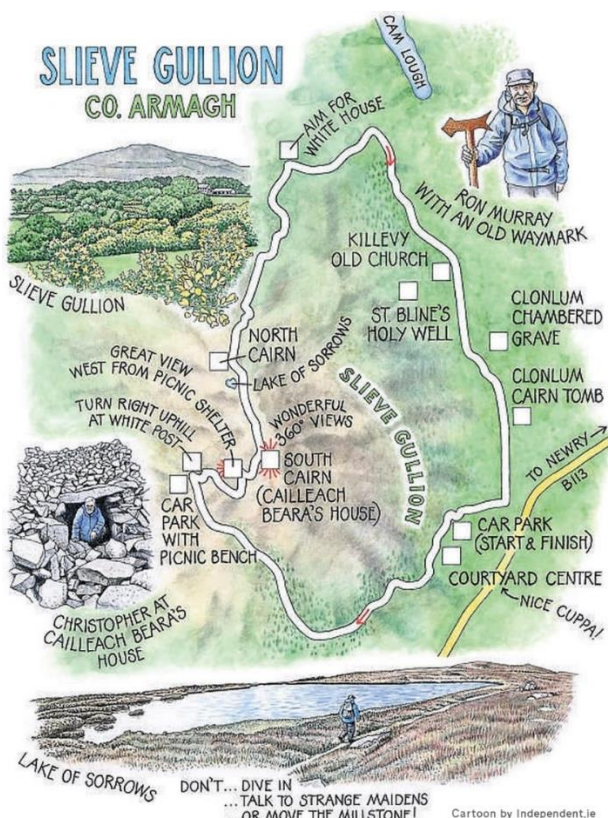
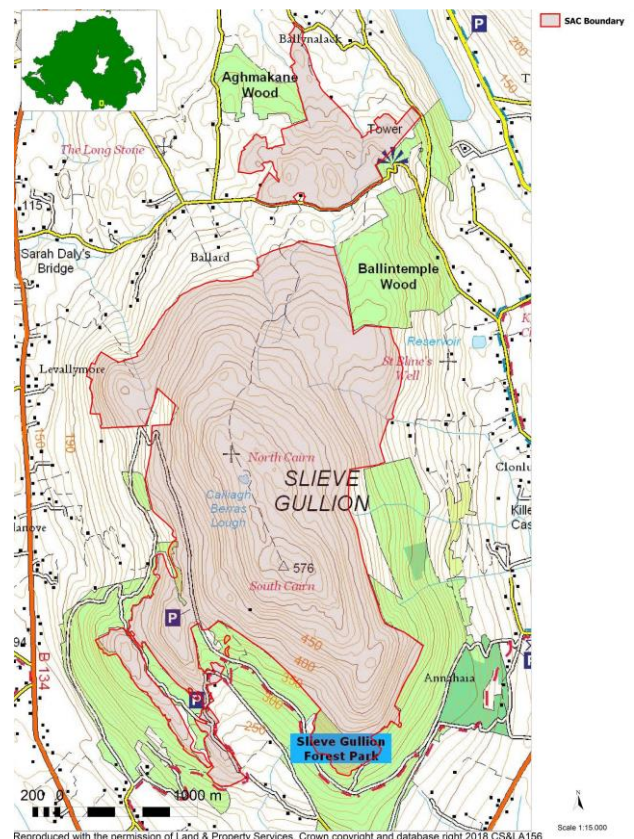


Slieve Gullion SAC Stakeholder Consultation

The Slieve Gullion Special Area of Conservation (SAC) lies at the heart of Ring of Gullion AONB and the Mourne Gullion Strangford Aspiring UNESCO Global Geopark. It is a protected landscape of European importance as a striking example of a ring dyke formation. Like all scenic areas, there are opportunities for tourism and recreation, while traditional farming is required to maintain the internationally important peatland habitats. The area has both high scenic and biodiversity interest and is used in a variety of ways which have implications for the management of the habitat.
